January 9, 23, 30, February 6 & 13

1. **Caring for Our Outdoor Friends** w/ Mrs. Jones and Mr. Blacow (gr 3-5) Do you like arts and crafts, nature, writing, the outdoors and science? We will learn how to map using a compass, learn about animal habits in winter, write poetry and our own stories about our activities.
