Sept. 13, 20, 27, Oct. 4, 11

1. **Spelling Bee** w/ *Mrs. Berry* (gr 5)
Are you competitive? Do you like a challenge? Join up with 6th graders on Monday and be part of our Spelling Bee team. In October, we will join the competition with other 5/6 teams in the district. 2. **Creative Problem Solving** w/ *Ms. Dan'Sy* (gr 4-5)

3. **Fishing** w/ *Julie Bett* (gr 1-5) Students will assist each other in assembling equipment, measuring their catch, learn proper casting techniques, a visit from the game warden will tell you what fish are in season as well as size appropriate. This is a fun way to finish off your school day and enjoy being outdoors.

4. **Homework Club/Tutoring** w/ *Mrs. Berry* (gr 3-5) Stumped on that tough math problem? Don't understand what your science lesson is? This program is designed to reinforce students' learning and understanding by focusing on individual needs.
